

 Many pathways are worth taking. I need to explore viable education and career options, set goals and make plans.




How do I get there?

Direct School Admission to Junior Colleges (DSA-JC)



- Aptitude-based admission
- Allows students to apply and secure a place in the JC, based on talents and achievements like sports, performing arts or specific academic areas.

- Check individual JC's website for DSA category and criteria.
- Students assessed through trials, auditions, interviews, portfolio reviews.
- If successful, students given a conditional offer before sitting for 'O' levels.
- Offer is confirmed if student meets L1R5
 ≤ 20 and subject requirements for
 admission to JC.
- With confirmed offer, students cannot transfer schools.



- Offer is confirmed if student fulfils ELR2B2 ≤ 26 and minimum entry requirements for the course.
- With confirmed offer, students cannot switch course within or across Polytechnics.


